Registrations will be accepted on the day of the event IF there is room on the schedule for additional teams.

Minimum Entry Fee per team is \$200.00. This must be paid by the start of the event.

Last, but not least, HAVE FUN and take the TROPHY and the BRAGGING RIGHTS HOME!!

Join the fun and *PULL* for a great cause!

The winner of the Fire Truck Pull will take the trophy home (after it is engraved) to be displayed for bragging rights for one year. Should there be no specific location to display the trophy, it may be displayed at the Jerseyville Fire Department for the year. The trophy must be returned at the time of next year's event to be awarded to the next champion.

Information and Pull Rules**

1. Registration fee of \$200 per team must be submitted before the event begins.
2. Participants must be at least 14 years of age to participate. All participants must sign the waiver of liability. Anyone under the age of 18 must have signed parental consent form.
3. No more than 8 members are allowed to pull unless a team consists of ALL women in which case, up to 10 members will be allowed.
4. A complete "pull" will be designated 150-foot course.
5. We will designate one starting judge, and one timer judge at finish line. The ruling of the judges stands.
6. Should there be a tie, there will be a pull-off to determine the winner.
7. The top fundraising team will receive a one second advantage on their time.
8. Participants are encouraged to wear loose fitting clothing, sneakers, and gloves for hand protection. Wear your own team shirt if you like. **CLOSED TOE SHOES REQUIRED (NO flip-flops).**
9. Teams may not attach anything to the rope. They may remove slack but must not begin pulling until signaled. No jerking of the rope is allowed.
10. There is a maximum time for a pull. After 5 minutes, if your team has not pulled the Fire Truck across the finish line, the team will be disqualified.
11. Immediately following the fire truck pull, we will have the team assemble in front of the fire truck for a team photo.
12. An awards ceremony will take place immediately following the close of the competition.

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The team goal is a minimum of \$200.

Below are several ideas that will help you achieve your team's fundraising goal; however, the possibilities are endless and we encourage you to be creative!

Take advantage of significant dates. Use birthdays and surgery dates as reasons to donate – for example, if the birthday of the person you're raising money in honor of is on the 10th of the month, ask donors to donate \$10 on that day. If they are having surgery on the 13th, ask donors to give \$13 to wish him or her luck.

Set silly mini-goals. Similar to rewards, setting a mini-goal that goes with a punishment for the organizer will help motivate people to donate. If you're just starting with a goal of \$5,000, you can boost donations by saying you'll shave your head when you hit your mini-goal of \$2,000.

Set up a donation jar at work and ask your coworkers to put a dollar in every time they swear!
